Local residents donate enough clothes to stretch the length of Loch Tay to charity

Following a successful trial with the Perth & Kinross council, social business Clothes Aid recently expanded the Kerbside Textile Collection service to reach 24,000 homes across the region. The service aims to increase the range of materials collected alongside household recycling. In four months local residents have donated enough unwanted items to stretch the length of Loch Tay (23.4km). This amounts to approximately 46,000 items which would otherwise have ended up as waste. If support continues at this rate, by Christmas almost 25 tonnes of unwanted clothing and textiles will be diverted from landfill and instead help to raise much needed funds for Children's Hospice Association Scotland (CHAS).

Clothes Aid have worked with CHAS since 2009. To date the partnership has raised over £444,000 for the charity. The charity provides the only hospice services in Scotland for children and young people. They run two children's hospices, Rachel House in Kinross and Robin House in Balloch as well as a home care service called CHAS at Home. CHAS offer professional care, practical help and emotional support for the whole family.

CHAS Retail Manager Pauline Tanbini said: "We've been absolutely delighted with the response to the Kerbside Textile Collection service and the initiative is a valuable option for households to be able to take part in across Perth and Kinross. Our partnership with Clothes Aid provides important support for our charity shops and helps raise vital funds to offer children and families essential care across Scotland and locally at Rachel House."

Kerbside collections provide a convenient way to both donate to charity and minimise waste. Homeowners should have received a Collection Calendar explaining how to donate. If they haven't received this calendar or if they've miss-placed it they should call the Clothes Aid helpline on 020 7288 8545.
